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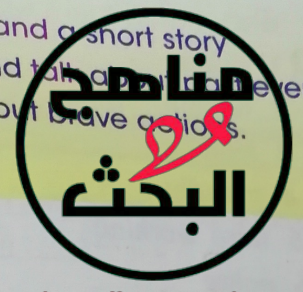

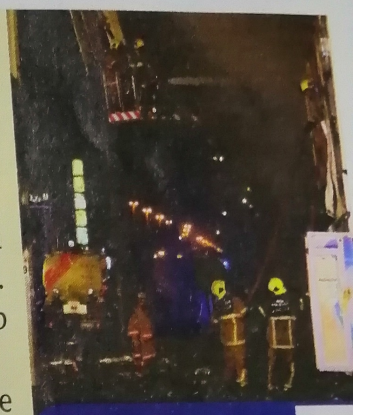
Dubai has over 196 high-rise buildings. If a fire starts in a tall building, it is very difficult to put it out.

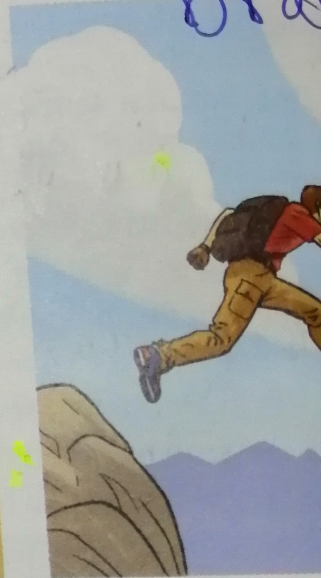
